First Team - Top of the League!

The first team started the 25/26 season off in emphatic style, notching an impressive 31 goals in the opening 4 matches, conceding just the 3! The great form continued in the league and cups, with an eye catching 4-2 home victory vs Tier 4 Chesham United in the FA Cup at Adams Park, coming back from 2 goals down in the process in front of 250+ Chairgirls fans! Following this success, the squad then went on to record further impressive cup runs and league form, with results of interest being an outstanding 5-2 home victory in the Midweek Isthmian Cup vs Tier 3 Billericay Town and entertaining an average crowd of 75 - 100 weekly. In November, our FA Cup and County Cup dreams fell, as we were knocked out of both competitions in the space of 2 weeks and on both occasions on penalties. However, holding Tier 4 opposition (Abingdon United and Bridgwater respectively) to close-fought 1-1 draws, shows just how far we have come and the potential of this squad. Heading into the Christmas break, we finished the year with a 0-0 draw with Reading followed by a 9-1 victory over Beaconsfield, sending supporters home with an early Christmas present! Those results meant we have now seen the first team go an entire calendar year without losing a league game - which is some achievement! 2025 ended with the ladies sat in 1st in the Southern Region Premier Division, in the Isthmian Midweek Cup Semi Final and the Combined Counties Cup and League Cup Quarter Finals - the treble remains on. We kick off 2026 with away games vs Oxford City and Reading, followed by a midweek cup semi final vs Bowers and Pitsea - we'd love to see you there or at Burnham later in the month.

U18's - Feeding the First Team

Our U18's kick started their season with some very high scoring pre-season friendlies, including an 18-0 victory vs Sussex RTC and a convincing 5-0 win over a college team from California, USA. The U18's then went into a 5 game JPL cup league, to determine which division we would be placed in for the season. There were some hugely impressive results in this stage, resulting in the team being placed in the JPL Warriors Premier Division. This is the highest standard JPL league and the first time we have qualified, so a significant success. So far in this league we have seen a 6-5 victory over Epsom and Ewell, a 4-2 loss to Fulham and a 3-2 loss to Plymouth with some very exciting fixtures to come verses the likes of Crystal Palace, London City Lionesses and Oxford United. This shows the standard the U18's are performing at, mixing with teams who perform at the very top of the female pyramid. Through to the quarter finals of the JPL Cup, after a very one sided 14-1 victory over Atalanta in the previous round and just two results away from a county cup final vs MK Dons, the second half of the season promises to be an exciting one.

U16's - The Future is Bright

A completely new squad this season, the U16's are now bustling with talent, demonstrating outstanding recruitment and the strength of connection between the Foundation's GDA (Girls Development Academy) programme, Talent ID and Henley College programmes. Transition from these programmes has been seamless for many players now continuing their journey into elite U16's football with W3. Similar to the U18s, in the JPL Warriors there is a group stage of matches to complete to determine which leagues teams are placed in. With a new squad and players needing a bit more time to adjust and settle to life at Wycombe, our opening fixtures were fairly mixed in terms of results with a 5-3 win vs Watford ladies, a 5-5 draw vs QPR and a 5-4 loss vs Reading but very consistent in terms of potential shown by the players! As we have progressed through the opening months of the season, the team has developed a strong bond and connection which is showing on the pitch, finishing the year with very strong results including an 8-0 victory over St Albans, 5-4 win over Hartland Girls and a 9-0 win over Watford Ladies. The girls have progressed to the JPL Cup Quarter Final and need a single result to go our way to gain a place in the Berks and Bucks County Cup Final - so lots to play for! Good luck girls.
